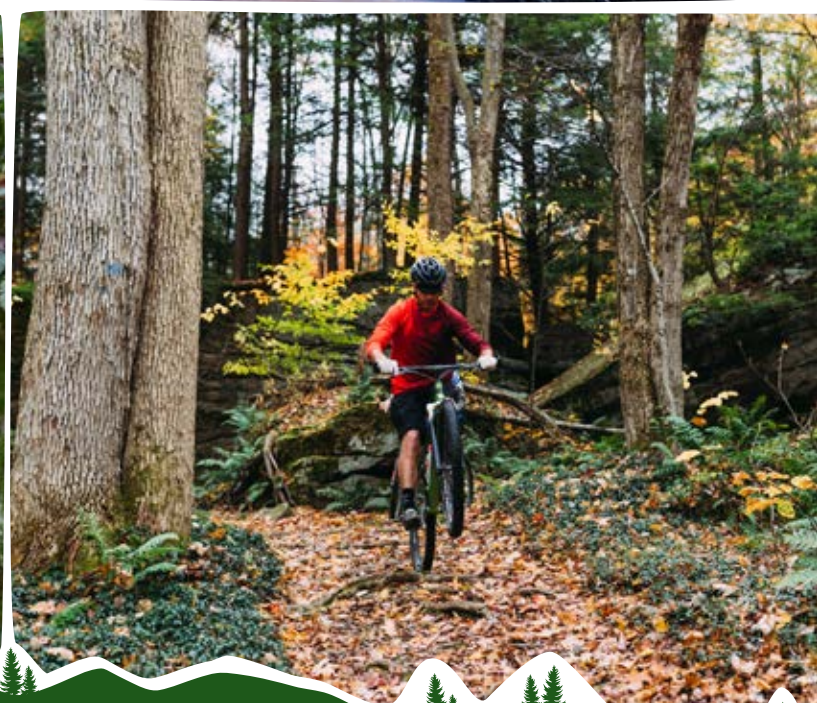
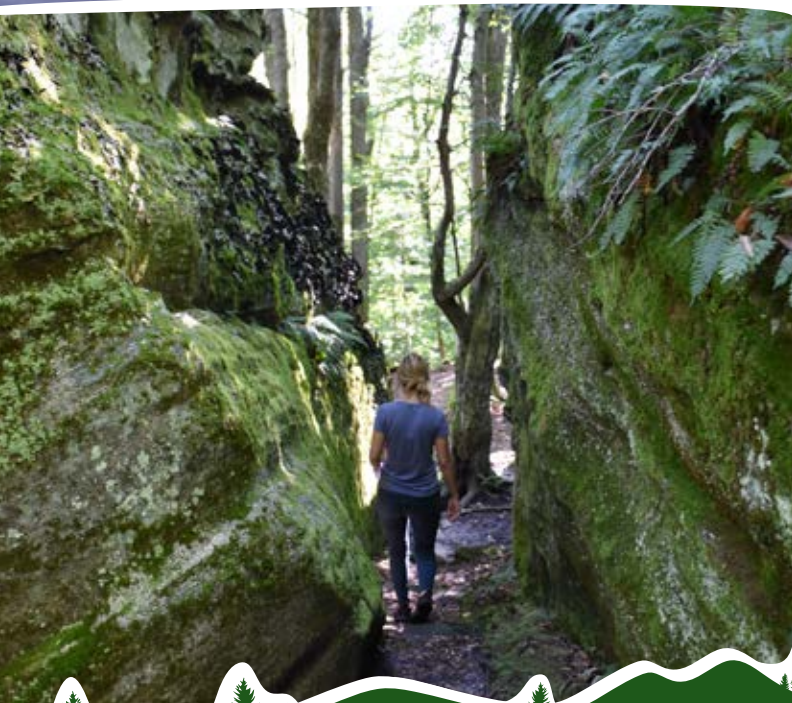

Allegany State Park

The Largest State Park in New York State

New York's Largest State Park lies right in **Salamanca's** backyard and offers a multitude of year-round, outdoor activities. The **two sections of the park**, Red House Area and Quaker Area, offer natural adventures for those seeking to explore the great outdoors.

The **Art Roscoe Trail System** features 24 miles of interconnecting loop trails. These trails are some of the **best single-track and double-track Mountain Biking in Western NY**. There are miles of other trails, perfect for hiking, horseback riding, mountain biking, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Bikes and cross-country ski rentals are available.

In the summer months, enjoy Red House and Quaker Lakes. Whether you like to swim, fish, kayak, or just relax on the sandy beach, there's something for everyone.

Spend time **picnicking with your family**, playing basketball, tennis, horseshoes, volleyball with friends, or just letting the children spend time on one of the playgrounds.

Whether you're yearning to be surrounded by wilderness and not much more, or you simply want to experience the outdoors with the

comforts of home, Allegany State Park has you covered. Able to accommodate any size group, Allegany State Park offers a total of 348 cabins, 4 group camps, 53 upscale cottages, and 3 campgrounds in the park. Tent, camper, and RV site rentals are available.


Visitors will enjoy the interesting exhibits found in the **Natural History Museum** located in the Red House Administration Building. The **old Quaker Store** houses a park museum displaying unique features and attractions both past and present, and the history of Allegany State Park.

We recommend asking for a schedule of events at the park to catch an activity with one of the park's naturalists, as they have knowledge on the flora and fauna.


There are gift shops, a restaurant, and other attractions such as the **Stone Tower, Thunder Rocks**, a beaver pond, Bridal Falls, and the old fire towers. Enjoy time making memories around the campfire with your family and friends.

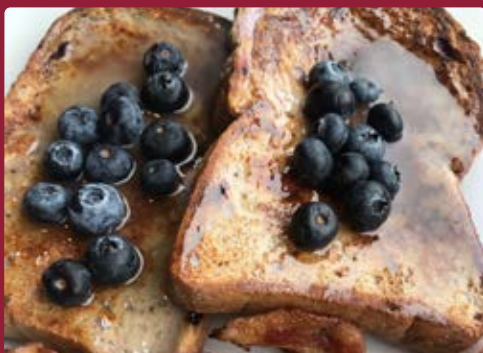

Cross Country Skiing

The cross country ski trails in the Enchanted Mountains offer pristine views of the woods and numerous miles of coverage in one area.

The **Art Roscoe Trail System** is widely considered the best cross country ski trails in Western NY and Northeastern PA with approximately 24 miles of trails, groomed on an as-needed basis, all of which begin at the Summit Warming Hut in Allegany State Park.

Snow Tubing

Snow tubing is enjoyable for the whole family.

Holiday Valley Tubing Company is a 22-lane tubing park. Feel the rush of the cold winter air as you sail down a 900-foot lane with a 100 foot vertical drop.

Ready to go again? There's the **conveyor lift** to pull you up the hill.

Do you want to hang out on a smaller hill? Try the Lil' Tubers Hill.

A warming hut is available at the base with a snack bar, fireplace, and restrooms.

Check the snow reports for updates by calling 716-699-TUBE! The typical tubing season is from mid-December to mid-March.

There are two great places to ski and snowboard in the Enchanted Mountains: **Holiday Valley Resort** and **HoliMont**, in the small ski town of Ellicottville.

HoliMont is North America's Largest Private Ski Resort, but opens its doors to non-members during the week. The terrain is incredible, the lift lines are short, and the grooming is impeccable. The slopes at HoliMont are North-facing, creating amazingly true fall lines. This resort has a family-friendly atmosphere, 55 slopes and trails, and 100% snowmaking coverage. Learn more at HoliMont.com.

Holiday Valley Resort features 60 trails and slopes with a 750-foot vertical drop, 13 lifts, and 4 terrain parks. While Mother Nature provides plenty of snow, dropping on average 180 inches of snowfall each year, Holiday Valley takes it to another level. Each year, they invest in snowmaking equipment, currently totaling 701 snow guns and 95% snowmaking coverage. Holiday Valley offers nighttime skiing at its finest—39 slopes and trails remain open well after dark, creating a magical world of twinkling lights dotting the slopes. Snowmobile

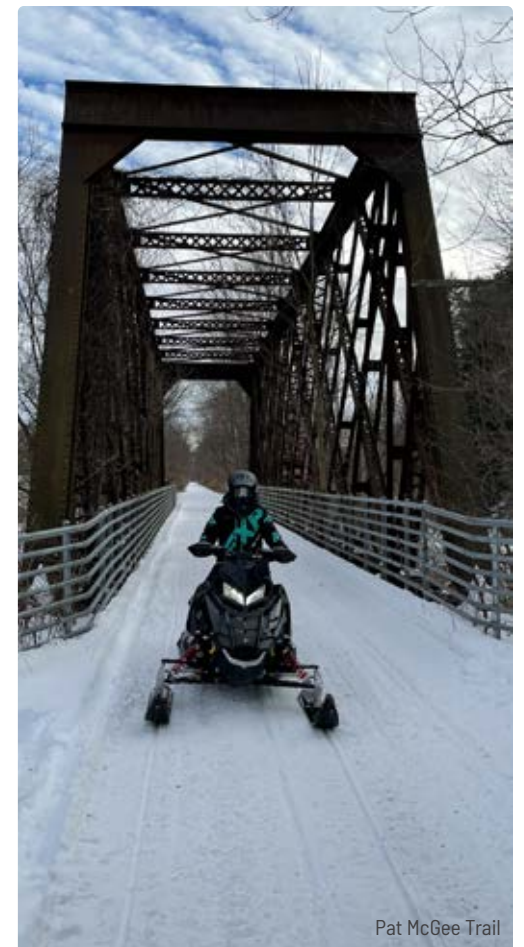

Other hot spots include Lime Lake, Case Lake, New Albion Lake, and Harwood Lake.

Each year the DEC Randolph Fish Hatchery stocks the above-mentioned lakes: once in the spring and again in the fall with surplus brood stock.

Snowshoe

Check out the **"Bear Paw" Trail** at **Allegany State Park**, a great trail to start a snowshoeing adventure. It will lead you behind the Summit Area and towards Stone Tower.

Pfeiffer Nature Center has over **nine miles** of trails between its two properties, Eshelman and Lillibridge. Open dawn to dusk year round, these free trails offer everything from short level walks to long rugged climbs. Enjoy deep woods and open meadows, creeks and ponds, and lots of great wildlife habitats. Eshelman is closed October through December for hunting season.

Cattaraugus Creek offers Class III and IV whitewater for you to whitewater raft and kayak in. **Peak whitewater season is early spring** as snow begins to melt and then again in the fall, when the rains raise the water level back up. Bicycling

Plan some time with your friends on the following trails:

Allegheny State Park offers **5.6 miles of paved trail** on the Red House side of the park with 3.1 miles looping around Red House Lake. Rentals are available at the Red House Lake Boat area.

The **Allegheny River Valley Trail** is **6.2 miles of paved trail** that runs along the Allegheny River, through Olean, and around St. Bonaventure University. This is a great option for a family or beginner as there are benches with river views all along the trail. Rentals are available at **Twist 'n Shake**.

The **Pat McGee Trail**, originally a branch of the Erie Railroad line in 1851, was converted into a multi-use trail and offers **12 miles of scenic riding trails**.

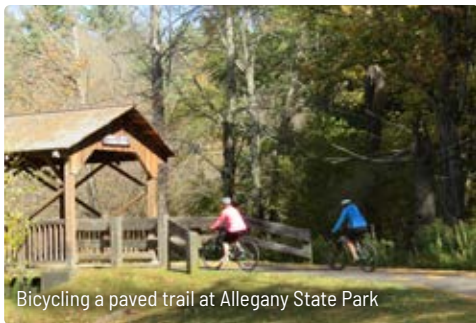

The country roads winding through the rolling hills of the Enchanted Mountains are great for road biking.

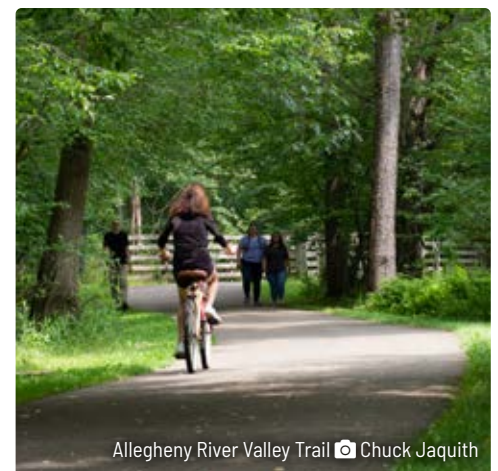
Check out some of these routes that start and finish at the **Inn at Holiday Valley**.

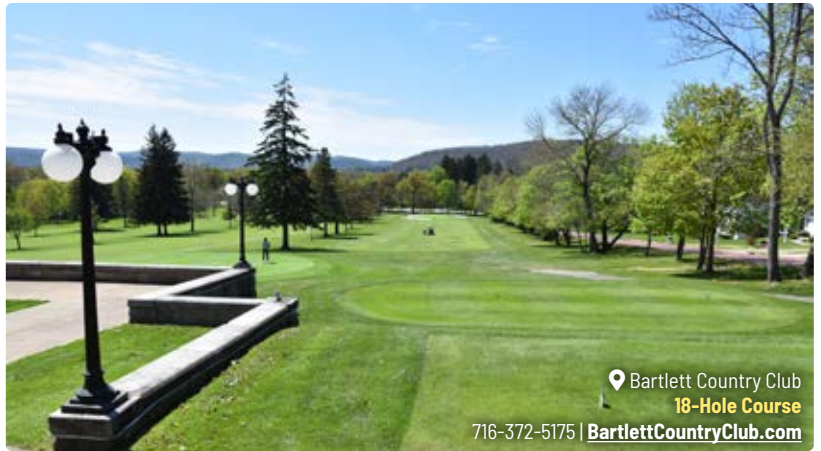

Sky High Adventure Park



Located at **Holiday Valley Resort**, **Sky High Aerial Adventure Park** has an **Aerial Park**, a **Climbing Forest**, a **Mountain Coaster**, and a **Gem Mining area!**

The **Aerial Adventure Park** is a playground in the trees that features a series of platforms and bridges to challenge your strategies, strength, and balance to complete. There are 13 total courses of varying difficulty to choose from. Cross bridges, climb ladders and soar on zip lines to get to the next platform.

The **Sky Flyer Mountain Coaster** is a roller coaster that zig zags and spirals down 2,940 feet of mountain while maneuvering 15 curves, 12 waves, a jump, and a corkscrew spiral. Riders can control the speed of their car to take advantage of this thrilling adventure or slow it down to a slow and steady ride of leisure.

The **Mister Happy Gem Mining** area is for kids to experience old-fashioned panning for gold, except they have a three pound bag of sand containing gems, fossils or sharks teeth. The little miners will dump the contents of their bag into a frame with a screen on the bottom to wash the sand away to see what treasures are left behind.

The **Climbing Forest** is a 3D version of a climbing wall. There are 9 trees outfitted with color coded climbing holds and the difficulty ranges from very easy to very challenging. Each climber is fitted with a harness that is clipped into an Auto Belay system.

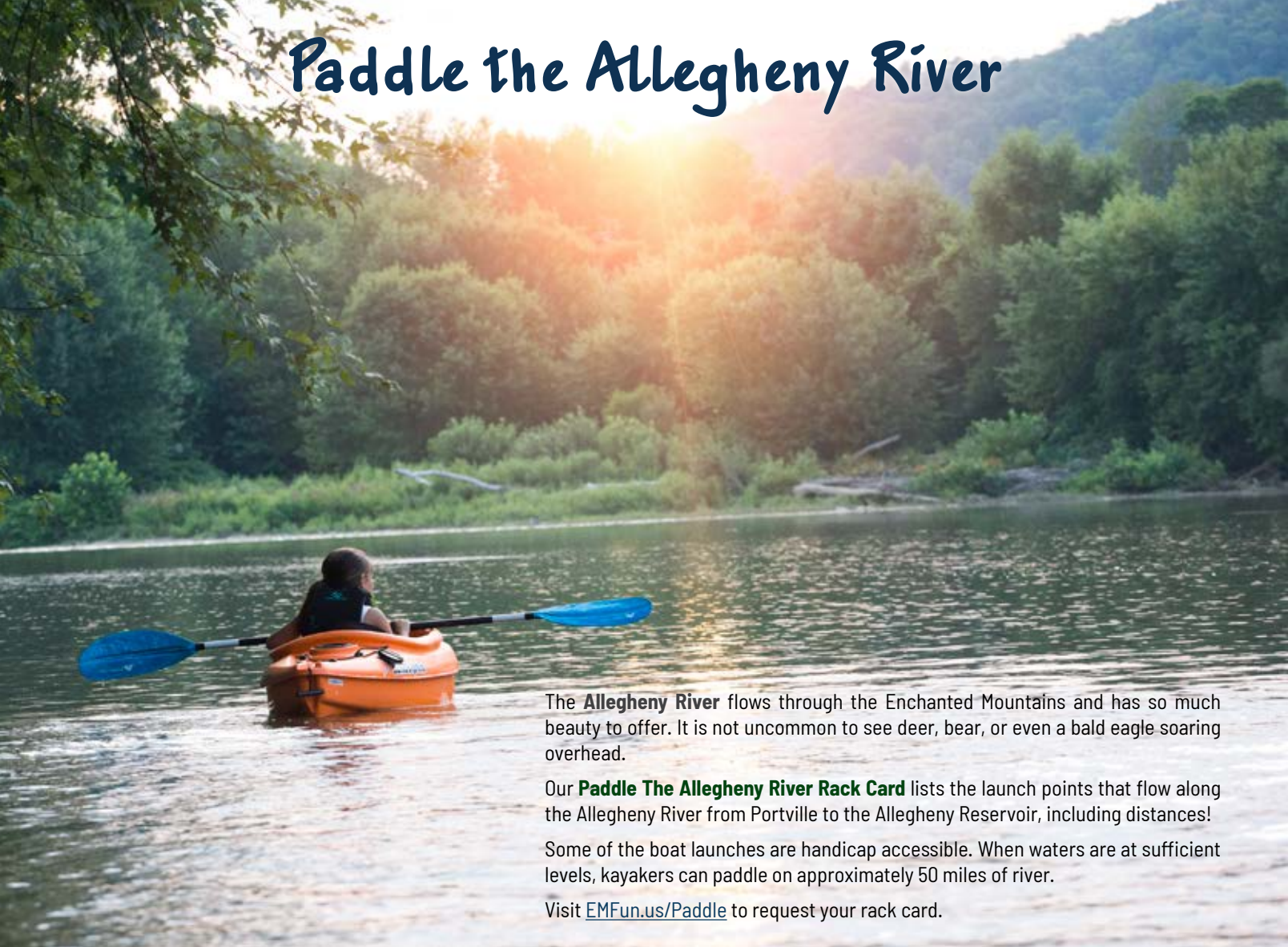

Explore unpaved trails scattered throughout the **Allegany State Park**. The **Art Roscoe Cross Country Ski Trails** offers some of the finest mountain bike trails in the Northeast, with views of the surrounding mountains and Red House Lake.

At HoliMont's new Bike Park, there are currently eight mountain bike trails that make up nearly ten miles of track with more trail building in the works! The trail is open for public riding and offers a fun and flowy ride down some of the most scenic slopes HoliMont has to offer.

Lift service for mountain biking is available seasonally.

Holiday Valley has a 4-5 mile "race loop" offering wider and more forgiving cross country trails or skinny winding single track. **Lift Service Mountain Biking and Mountain Bike rentals** are available at **Holiday Valley** by calling (716) 699-2345.

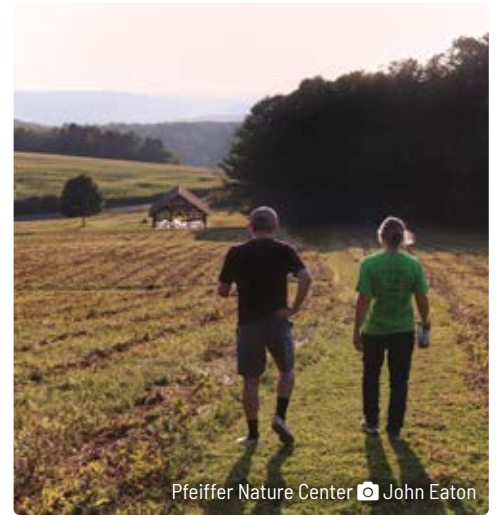

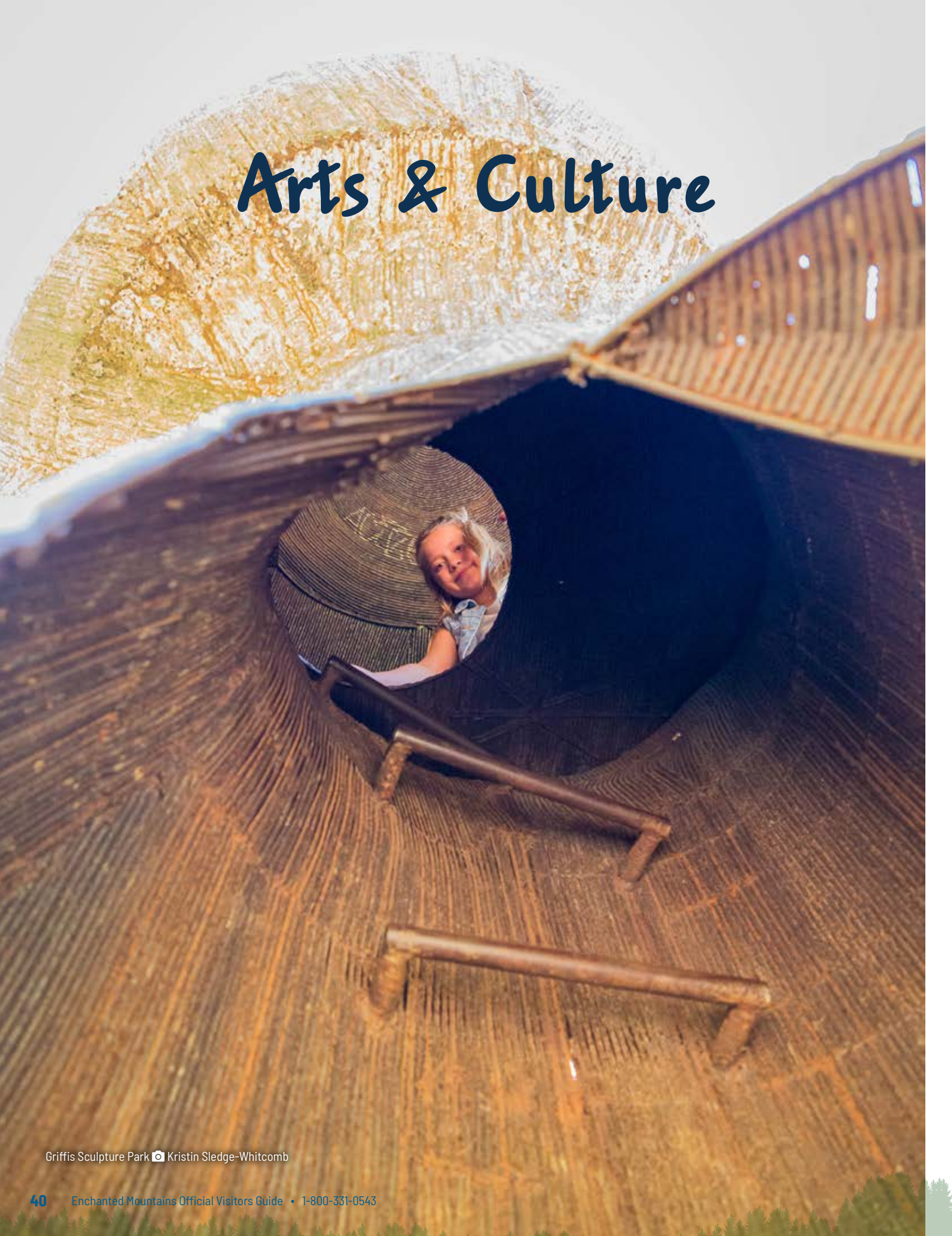

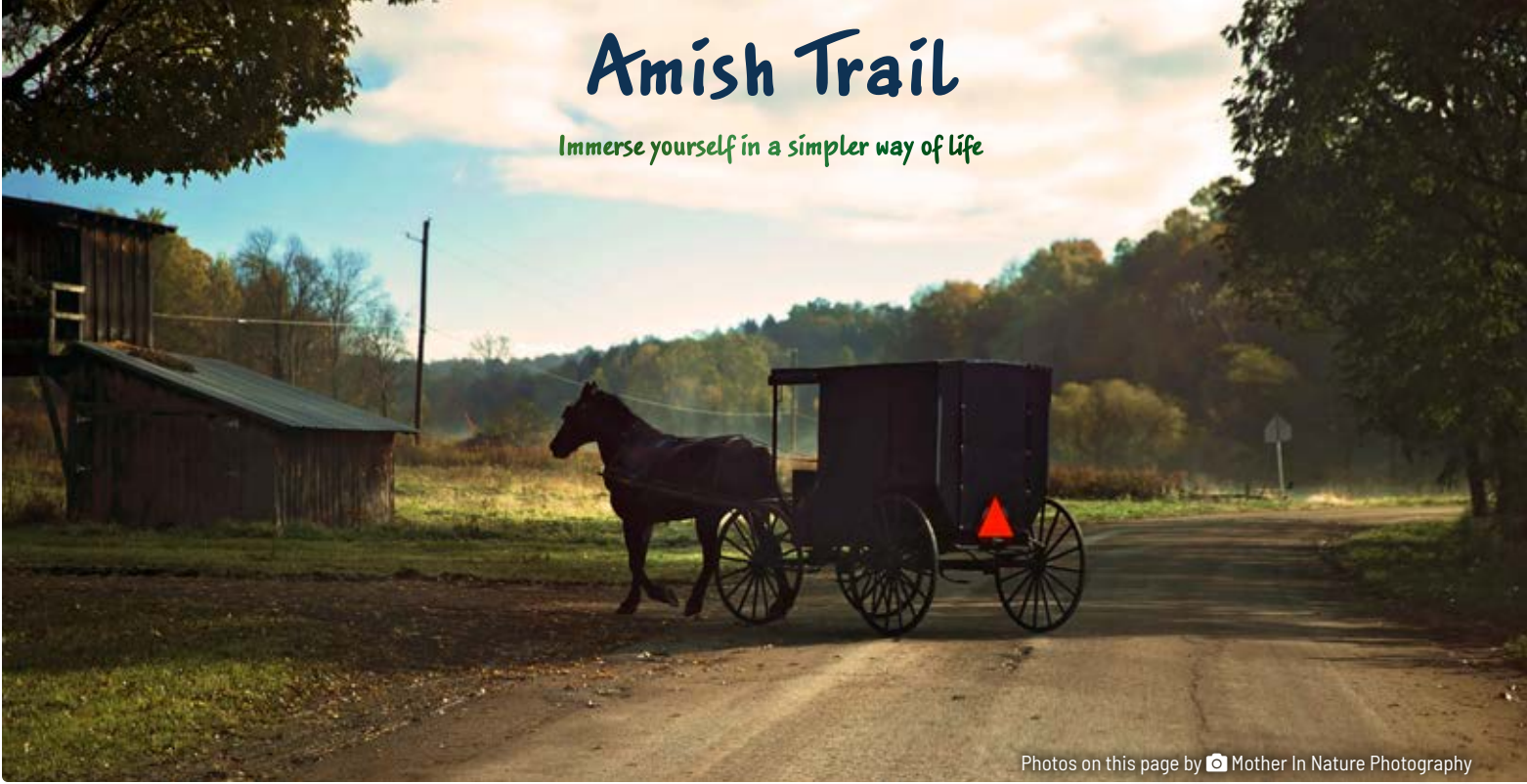

New York's Amish Trail in Cattaraugus County is not your typical Amish community; **this pastoral settlement consists of an Old Order Amish** people that continue to live out their day to day lives the old-fashioned way.

This is a place where you can take a step back in time, slow down, and enjoy a simpler way of life. Follow hand-painted signs down the side roads to the Amish businesses where you can purchase a wide variety of goods, each made with incomparable hand craftsmanship. No modern conveniences such as electric and motorized vehicles are used to carry out their responsibilities for the day.

Please remember to respect the privacy and personal property of our Amish neighbors. They do not like to be photographed as it is against their beliefs. Photos of the scenic countryside can be taken. As you tour the enchanted countryside, drive cautiously and watch for black, slow-moving, horse-drawn buggies.

Leave your debit and credit cards at home as they only accept cash. Shops are closed on Sundays, some Wednesdays, and certain holidays.

Onöndowa'ga: Great Hill People

The Seneca Nation has a rich and full history with a culture that everyone can experience today. The vibrancy of this rich heritage is evident in the cultural events, dance, music, arts, crafts, and foods that visitors are invited to experience. Highlights include the Main Street Mural overlooking the Allegheny River, Native American Arts, the Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans PowWow, Seneca Gaming and Entertainment, Seneca Nation Library, Highbanks Campground, SnowSnake, lacrosse games, and the Onöhsagwë:dé Cultural Center which has been awarded the Tribal Destination of the Year.

The **Seneca Nation** has over 8,500 enrolled members and holds title to five territories in Western New York, specifically, the **Allegheny, Buffalo Creek, Cattaraugus, Niagara Falls, and Oil Spring territories**. The **Seneca Nation is one of the original Five Nations of the Hodinöhsyöniñ, or Iroquois Confederacy**. This union was created to bring peace to the Hodinöhsyöniñ, also known as the **"People of the Longhouse."** Comprised of Chiefs from the Seneca, Cayuga, Onondaga, Oneida, and Mohawk, it operated under a sophisticated oral tradition. This code of conduct is known as the **Great Law of Peace**. The union was later expanded to include the Tuscarora, becoming the Six Nations of the Iroquois Confederacy.

The Hodinöhsyöniñ nations' contiguous lands originally stretched across what is now New York State, similar to the shape of a longhouse. The **Seneca controlled trade and traffic at**

the western edge of the Iroquois territory, which is why they are referred to as **"Keepers of the Western Door."**

Like other Iroquois nations, the Seneca people historically lived in longhouses, which were long, narrow bark-covered dwellings that housed several families. The Seneca are known as Onöndowa'ga:, (pronounced: Oh-n'own-dough-wahgah) or **"Great Hill People."** Traditional Seneca culture is defined by the clan system. There are **eight clans among the Seneca: Bear, Beaver, Turtle, Wolf, Deer, Hawk, Heron, and Snipe**. Clan membership is matrilineal - it is passed on to children through their mothers. The Seneca are a matriarchal society that has participated in what is accepted as the first modern democracy in the Western hemisphere since 1100 A.D.

The Seneca would hunt, fish, farm, and forage their food. Staples of the Seneca crop and diet were corn, beans, and squash, which are referred to as "Jöhegöh," the Three Sisters—considered to be special gifts from the Creator. Every aspect of the Seneca's daily life came from the land or nature, including clothing, tools, cooking utensils, crafts and other materials.

The Nation continues to live in and care for the forests, valleys, and shorelines of Western New York which has been a prominent tradition since before reported history. The Creator's gifts from the land and waters are revered among the Seneca, as it is their obligation to pass along this legacy to future generations.

Part of sharing our natural resources, The **Seneca Nation operate Highbanks Campground**, located directly on the **Allegheny Reservoir**, overlooking the scenic view of the region's rolling hills. Enjoy the comforts of cabins and chalets, relax in your RV, or pitch a tent to sleep under the stars. Tent and recreational vehicle sites have picnic tables and fire pits to relax in front of, complete with water and electrical hookups. Highbanks is open year round and is fun for the entire family!

When visiting sacred sites or grounds please respect the old structures, do not remove any artifacts, and be cautious of the landscaping and vegetation in the area as Nation and Federal law prohibit the removal or desecration of such items.

When attending powwows, socials, or ceremonial events, please honor the traditions and witness the event as a spectator. Please approach dancers and singers respectfully and ask for permission to take photos and/or video.

The home of the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum

The **Onöhsagwë:dé Cultural Center** in Salamanca, is truly a place you need to experience. The impressive facility houses the **Seneca-Iroquois National Museum**, and has components of an educational facility, living culture elements, and performance spaces.

The Cultural Center is named after Richard "Onöhsagwë:dé" Johnny-John. "Onöhsagwë:dé" means "an opening in the house." He spent his whole life on the Allegany Territory, dedicating many years to preserving Seneca history and culture by becoming a bilingual specialist for the Seneca Nation.

The Cultural Center brings ample space and the technology needed to bring some of the Seneca artifacts home and properly care for them.

95% of Seneca artifacts have never been on display due to their delicate nature.

A classroom is available for groups and **educational tours**. Students can be guided through the museum and then come back to the classroom for more educational videos and lectures and a chance to ask Cultural Specialists specific questions they may have.

The **interactive and informational exhibits** tell the history of the Seneca, from The Creation Story to present day. Other exhibits include a welcoming "Gustoweh," The Clan System, a log cabin that visitors can walk through, Seneca Women, Arts and Sports, The Kinzua Dam Project. While there are opportunities to touch or listen to certain components of these exhibits, tours are also available and highly recommended.

There is an amphitheater in the back of the building to host events.

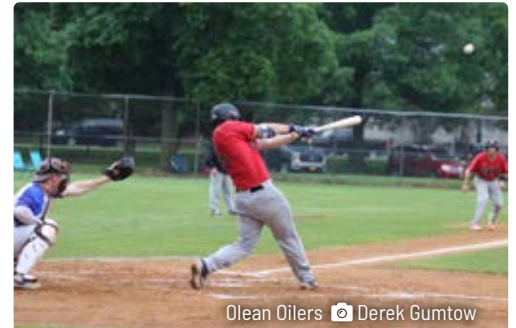

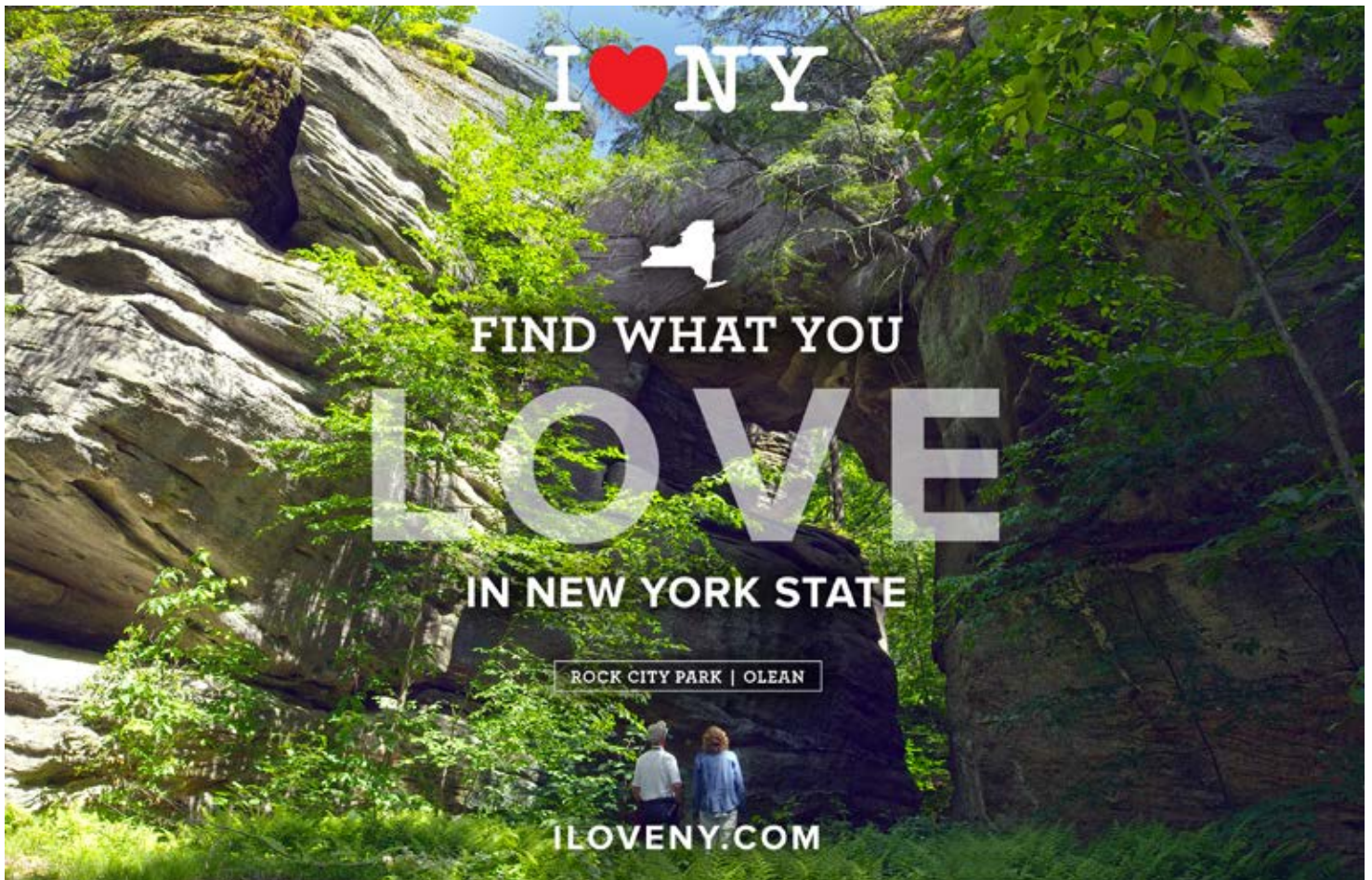

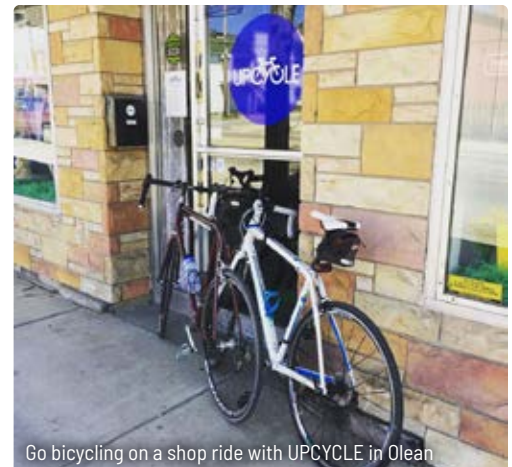
